This will enable us to observe the government regulations which ask that we keep a record for 21 days to assist with 'Test and Trace.'

The New Normal:



Due to the size of St Theresa's Church we will follow a system of first in last out. The stewards will guide you to your place and will indicate when you can leave.

The 2 metre social distancing will be observed and for that reason some of the benches will be taped off and we are asked to avoid gathering with others inside or in the vicinity of the Church. There will be a basket for your offertory donation at the back of Church. **Face masks will be compulsory from Saturday 8th August.**


